



- * Focus of fourth grade areas for improvement.


Westside Elementary School



It is one of six elementary schools within the district that serve students in grades Pre-K through 5. For the past two years students in grades 3-5 have taken the Georgia Milestone Assessment. Prior to that students took the Georgia CRCT.






Student Ethnicity 2015-2016 School Year







Data Overview: Whole School Demographic Trends

- * Whole school population has remained around the same over the last 5 years with slight variation.
- * Female population slightly outnumbers male population.
- * The school has a diverse population, white students make up the highest percentage at 50%. Black, Asian Pacific Islander, Hispanic, and Multi-racial make up the other 50%.
- * Diversity is spread evenly throughout the school.
- * Only one student is Asian Pacific Islander.

Georgia Milestones Assessment

- * "Comprehensive summative assessment that measures how well students have learned the knowledge and skills outlined in the state content standards." -Gadoe
- * Tests are made up of multiple choice and constructed response questions.
- * "Norm-referenced items in all content areas to complement the criterion referenced information and to provide a national comparison." -GaDOE

Understanding the Georgia Milestones Score Reports


- * ACHIEVEMENT LEVEL: Milestones results are reported using four categories of achievement that are represented with bar stacks.
- * SCALE SCORE: A scale score is the total number of correct answers converted to a consistent and standardized scale across different forms of the test. Within each range of scores, achievement will fall in one of four achievement levels. The scale score range varies from subject to subject and grade to grade based on the actual test.
- * The Comparison chart shows scale score ranges for each achievement level and how your student's score compares to averages for the school, the school district, and the state.
- * Lexile information measures a student's reading ability.
- * The EOG assessment included a small number of questions in each content area that are used on a nationally norm-referenced test, TerraNova. This information provides a general snapshot of how a student's answers compare to a national sample of students in the same grade.


- * For each content area students receive a scale score. The scale score will fall into one of four categories depending on the grade level and content area.
- * The "Domain Category" is the area of focus tested in the subject area for a particular grade level.
- * Domain mastery indicators provide diagnostic information about a student's strengths and areas of need for different aspects of test content.
 - * Remediate Learning (lowest level of performance)
 - Monitor Learning (acceptable level of performance)
 - * Accelerate Learning (highest level of performance)










FOURTH GRADE LANGUAGE ARTS COMPARISON 2015 & 2016











Georgia Milestones Language Arts Strengths

- * Grades 3 and 5 Language Arts- both showed growth from 2015 to 2016
- * Grade 4 had more students in the Distinguished Learner category in 2016 than in 2015.
- * The school had more students in the developing learning, proficient learner, and distinguished learner categories than the district did in Reading and Vocabulary.




- * Writing and Language Strand

Georgia CRCT

- * Criterion-referenced test-measures how well a student acquires, and learns the knowledge and skills set forth in instruction.
- * Tests are multiple choice only.
- * Aligned with Georgia Performance Standards.

CRCT LANGUAGE ARTS RESULTS COMPARISON GRADES 3-5, 2013 & 2014





These percentages were pulled from the Georgia Department of Education Website, they did not have total number of students tested listed.

Georgia CRCT Language Arts Strengths

- * Growth was made from 2013 to 2014 in the Language Arts domain.
- * About 70% of the student population at Westside met or exceeded the on the CRCT.
- * Students had been taking this test for much longer and were more accustomed to seeing this type of questions.

Georgia CRCT Language Arts Weaknesses

- * The test was only made up of multiple choice questions.
- * Students in Grade 3 did not score as well overall as students in grades 4 and 5.

Discussion Question Based on Language Arts Overview

- * According to the Georgia Milestones results, where are students in the fourth grade performing the best within the context of Language Arts?
- * Is there a correlation between demographics and the Georgia Milestones results? How can they be addressed in the classroom?
- * How can we get students from the beginning learner level to the proficient learner or advanced learner level?
- * According to the Georgia Milestones data, what strand of Language Arts are students struggling the most?
- * Can we compare the Georgia Milestone results with the CRCT results? Why or why not?
- * Are the CRCT or the Georgia Milestones scores more reliable?
